- To provide advice and support on local and corporate funding sources (for example Ward Committee Grant Aid).
- To develop, maintain and facilitate effective relationships with local people, communities, local organisations and partners to ensure they can engage and participate with the council on local neighbourhood issues.
- Support multi-disciplinary teams assigned to develop and deliver specific projects or programmes locally.
- 8 To manage local databases, community information systems and processes to ensure the council is effective in informing and involving residents.

- To promote and implement the council's Equality Policy in all aspects of employment and service delivery.
- To ensure, so far as is practicable, that the prevention of crime and disorder (including anti-social behaviour and other behaviour adversely affecting the local environment) is appropriately reflected in all policies, service plans and activities.
