Job Title: ICT and General Subjects Teacher

Responsible to: Head Teacher

Hours of work: Monday to Thursday, 08:30 hrs -16:30 hrs. Friday 08:30 hrs - 15:30 hrs.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide good/outstanding teaching and learning to secure high attainment of pupils, in collaboration with other members of the teaching team.
- Provide a nurturing classroom and school environment that helps pupils to develop as learners.
- Consistently plan, resource and deliver lessons that allow stimulating and enjoyable learning to take place across all abilities.
- Deliver effective literacy learning across the whole school to ensure literacy is embedded in all key stages.
- Help to establish and maintain excellent standards of behaviour for learning across the school.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

Teaching and Learning:

- To be a consistently good/outstanding teacher and deliver engaging and effective lessons that motivate, inspire and improve pupil attainment.
- Plan and prepare engaging lessons based on agreed schemes of work.
- Use regular assessments to monitor progress, set targets and determine appropriate intervention.
- Maintain regular and productive communication with parents, to report on progress and to relay other relevant information.
- Maintain accurate pupil data that can be used to make teaching more effective and identify pupils who need additional resources and/or support.
- Identify the intervention needs of pupils and appropriate strategies to improve attainment.
- Ensure appropriate assessment strategies are being used to assess pupil progress.
- Appropriately deploy Teaching Assistants assigned to your subject.
- Be observed in an appropriate and timely manner, including learning walks.

Progress and Achievement of Pupils:

- Ensure that all pupils are given quality feedback in order to make rapid and sustained progress.
- With the Head Teacher/Deputy Head, monitor and evaluate standards of achievement and pupil progress.
- Set targets for improvement and put together actions plans for implementation that form part of the School Development Plan.
- Identify any underachievement and, with the Head Teacher/Deputy Head and Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator, put plans in place to address any issues.
- With the Head Teacher/Deputy Head, analyse assessment data and ensure analysis and evaluations impact positively on pupil progress and outcomes for all pupils.
- Produce comprehensive end of term reports in a timely manner.

Parental Involvement and Community Links:

- To develop effective parental links.
- To seek the views of parents and pupils.
- To monitor and evaluate parental involvement and community links and their impact on outcomes for pupils.

Other:

- To support Talbot House Trust's commitment to safeguarding children and promoting their welfare and contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school.
- To proactively weave the core of your subject into every aspect of school life.
- To be a strong role model for pupils.

- Be aware of, and comply with key policies and procedures, for example, health and safety, equality and diversity, security, confidentiality, data protection, reporting all concerns to line management.
- Operate as supportive member of the teaching team by providing support and assistance to other members and attending and participating in team meetings.
- Participate in training, other learning activities and performance development as required.
