Students who finish the programme successfully qualify with a postgraduate diploma in social work. They will be able to register as social workers with the HCPC.



Step up to Social Work

The Step up to Social Work programme is a unique programme designed in collaboration between Manchester Metropolitan University and the 12 local authorities that make up the North East Region Partnership.

A key aspect of the programme is to make clear links between academic learning and social work practice.

Students on the programme will undertake 2 placements of 70 days and 100 days in one of the local authorities in the partnership and 30 skills days which is 200 days in total.

Where will I study

The degree programme is delivered by Manchester Metropolitan University however lectures are delivered in Sunderland city centre.

What Funding is available

There is a bursary payment of £19,833 (£1,322.20 per month) in total over 15 months to cover living expenses. In addition the partnership meets University tuition fees.

What qualifications do I need

Applicants must have 1 of the following;

a minimum 2:1 level 6 degree qualification

a minimum 2:2 honours degree plus a higher degree (level 7 or above, which can include a master's degree or a Postgraduate Certificate in Education)

Applicants must also have all of the following

GCSEs in English or English language and mathematics at grade C or above (or approved equivalent)

experience of voluntary or paid work with children, young people and families

the right to remain and work in the UK
