Purpose of this Role

The Head of English will ensure the consistent delivery of exceptional teaching within English across all schools within the Galileo Trust. The successful candidate will promote the raising of aspirations, progress and achievement within English.

Through inspirational leadership, strong subject knowledge and the capability to develop bespoke CPD and school improvement mechanisms, the successful candidate will implement high levels of professional standards to secure the highest possible achievement and progress for all pupils within English.

Key Responsibilities

- To promote and be committed to securing high expectations for learning and the raising of achievement within our academies
- To create a culture of constant, rapid improvement where people are inspired to continually achieve and revise their goals
- To provide strategic direction through the efficient monitoring, evaluation and improvement of the quality of teaching and learning in English
- To work alongside teachers and English Subject Leaders to develop and subsequently implement plans for school improvement
- To development innovative and successful strategies to improve the teaching of English
- To promote and be committed to Galileo Academy Trust's aims and objectives

Working alongside English Subject Leaders and Senior Leadership Teams in the Galileo Academy Trust to raise standards in English:

- Interpreting and analysing data, identifying groups of children who are or may underachieve;
- Monitoring and evaluating English teaching and learning to identify strengths and areas for development;
- Developing English action plans alongside English Subject Leaders that relate directly to the School Improvement Plan;
- Developing bespoke schemes of work and effective resources, supporting their introduction;



- Introducing innovative whole school approaches to issues affecting the progress of children in Reading and Writing within each school;
- Ensuring a positive reading culture is present within each school;
- Ensuring a consistent yet progressive approach to the teaching of English is present within every school in the trust;
- Ensuring teacher's English subject knowledge is strong and, where it is not, implementing a whole school CPD programme to rectify this;
- Leading the introduction of new technologies;
- Ensuring that the needs of all children in each school, including those who are vulnerable, are met.

Working alongside teachers to improve their teaching practice:

- Developing action plans based on the needs of individual teachers and their classes that provide structured support as required;
- Modelling outstanding lessons;
- Team teaching to support colleagues in providing outstanding lessons;
- Coaching teachers to improve their practice;
- Keeping abreast of new teaching and learning strategies;
- Developing strategies with colleagues to use with students experiencing difficulties;
- Identifying educational research to enhance existing practices;
- Supporting teachers in implementing effective interventions.

Advising on professional development:

- Designing and delivering CPD sessions that relate to the Galileo Trust Improvement Plan and the School Improvement Plans for Galileo schools;
- Participating in the planning and delivery of focused PD days as required;
- Leading moderation of all elements of English, through all key stages and year groups to ensure consistency in assessment across the trust;
- Coaching NQTs one-to-one as required to ensure they have the subject knowledge and skills required to teach English to a high standard.
