The Academy opened its doors to learners on 1 September 2009, and has embarked on an exciting new learning journey for young people in Ashington, Newbiggin-by-the-Sea and Lynemouth.

The Academy is seeking to significantly improve the life chances of young people within these communities by providing them with a strong foundation for lifelong learning and helping them to access the world of further and higher education. We aim to do this by equipping learners with the skills, knowledge and confidence to realise and surpass their expectations and potential. We wish learners to have the confidence to take risks and seize opportunities when they arise.

A school for children and young people aged 0 to 19. The Academy is one all-through school with a shared vision, core values and aspirations.

At present, the Academy operates from 7 separate campuses:

- Robert Stephenson
- Early Years Centre, Lynemouth

There has been an investment of £50M in new buildings, of which The Josephine Butler campus is the largest site and embraces primary and secondary learning and houses The Centre, a dedicated, fully-equipped special needs unit for 100 PMLD and SLD learners.

The Academy provides a caring and compassionate environment in which young people can be inspired to achieve great things. They are encouraged to play an active, informed role in the life of the Academy and in their communities.

Learners experience how working with others can inspire them. They develop an understanding that continuing their educational journey at the Academy beyond the age of 16 will increase their choice of destinations.

At present, there are 2,598 learners attending lower schools, with an additional 113 learners accessing Post-16 education.



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You will join a team of around 500 support staff and teachers at the Academy, who are all committed to working hard and making a difference to the education of our young people. As you would expect, we encourage all colleagues to keep their skills up to date by providing in-house and external training where necessary.
