We offer a range of courses which cover all aspects of the D&T disciplines and offer vocational opportunities. We value both specialist subject knowledge and Professional Development. ## Who Studies Health & Social and Technology at Churchill?

All students study Technology (Food, Resistant Materials and Textiles) in Key Stage Three as part of a carousel/rotation. We begin our Options Process at the end of Year 8 with students opting to study a range of subjects. We offer GCSE Design & Technology, Hospitality and Catering, VCERT Food and BTEC Technical Award (L2) Health & Social.

In the Sixth Form students can study A Level Design Technology, Level 3 Food Science and Nutrition and BTEC Level 3 Health & Social Care. At all Key Stages our subjects remain to be a popular choice with our students and achievement is strong.

With current educational reforms and the widespread changes to our suite of subjects this is a very exciting time for Technology and Health & Social Care.
