Job Purpose

To develop, deliver and promote Family Learning opportunities and programmes across Gateshead, Durham and South Tyneside

The key roles of this post will include:

- 1. To develop wide range of activities to engage and promote learning to families who have children aged 0 16 years old.
- 2. To develop Family English, Maths and Language and Wider Family Learning Programmes in accordance with the requirements of funding, local and national agendas.
- 3. To design and deliver programmes that include the use of appropriate assessment techniques, differentiated learning, Equality and Diversity and OLT including.
- 4. To teach Family English, Maths and Language programmes and Wider Family Learning Programmes in a flexible manner in partnership with teachers from participating schools and designated staff from Children's Centres.
- 5. Promoting and encouraging participation in Family Learning opportunities throughout the borough, particularly in areas where Family Learning is used to engage people who would not normally participate in lifelong learning
- 6. To work in partnership with organisations from within the local authority and voluntary organisations
- 7. To establish sound links with these organisations and feedback as and when appropriate
- 8. To provide progression opportunities for all adults involved in the programmes



- 9. To ensure management information is collected, collated and supplied according to requirements
- 10. To contribute and fully comply with quality assurance systems
- 11. To ensure a safe supportive learning environment which encourages high levels of performance
- 12. Such other responsibilities allocated which are appropriate to the grade of the post
