Main Duties: The following is typical of the duties the postholder will be expected

- 1. To lead or participate in projects and assignments as required.
- 2. To provide advice for executive and other committees regarding the relationship of the North of Tyne with businesses.
- 3. To develop and implement a co-ordinated approach to member development to support their leadership role.
- 4. To co-ordinate the Combined Authority's approach to growing key sectors in the Region and inward investment enquiries.
- 5. To develop policy and provide advice and guidance in strengthening relations with businesses.
- 6. To co-ordinate the Combined Authority's response to initiatives and investment proposals from existing businesses.
- 7. To work with officers across the North of Tyne to establish an effective performance management framework to ensure the business relations objectives are achieved.

- 8. To support the professional development of staff through coaching and mentoring as required.
- 9. To ensure, so far as is practicable, that the role of businesses is appropriately reflected in all directorate policies, service plans and activities.
- 10. To manage staff as allocated in line with Combined Authority procedures to ensure effective service delivery.
- 11. To collaborate with partners across the region to ensure a co-ordinated approach to businesses.
- 12. Liaise with the universities, other public-sector agencies and landowners and work with potential inward investors to increase the number of companies choosing to invest in the Region and to maximise investment from existing companies
- 13. To research, network and represent the Combined Authority nationally and regionally, so that the North of Tyne identifies and learns from best practice in other organisations.
- 14. To promote and implement the Combined Authority's Equality Policy in all aspects of employment and service delivery.
