Peripatetic Teacher for Children with Hearing Impairment (Qualified Teacher of the Deaf):

Part A

The following criteria (experience, skills and qualifications) will be used to short-list at the application stage:

Essential

- Qualified Teacher Status.
- 2. Mandatory qualification 'Teacher of the Deaf', as recognised by the Department of Education.
- 3. A good knowledge and understanding of National Curriculum key skills, current National Curriculum initiatives and the relevant statutory and non-statutory curricula / frameworks e.g. SEND, NHSP.
- 4. Working knowledge of the special education needs of deaf/hearing impaired children and young people.
- 5. Working knowledge of the assessments and monitoring tools necessary for monitoring the development of deaf/hearing impaired children and young people including those used with very young deaf/hearing impaired children e.g. 'Success from the Start'
- 6. Working knowledge of general early child development (0-3 year olds) and language development in particular
- 7. Experience of supporting deaf/hearing impaired children & young people, their families and schools or early-years settings
- 8. Working knowledge of the NatSIP Eligibility Criteria for support
- 9. Experience of working collaboratively with parents and a range of professionals working with SEND in Children and Young People
- 10. Good organisational skills and time management
- 11. Able to communicate effectively in Sign Communication (BSL and SSE)
- 12. Good working knowledge of audiological management and use of residual hearing

Desirable:

1. Postgraduate Diploma Deaf Education Studies (Early Years and Deafness)

Signature Level 2 qualification (or above) in BSL or be prepared to undertake training to this level

- Empathy for children and young people with SEND 2.
