Teacher for Children with Hearing Impairment/Deaf (Qualified Teacher of the Deaf):

Part A

The following criteria (experience, skills and qualifications) will be used to short-list at the application stage:

Essential

- 1. Qualified Teacher Status
- 2. Mandatory qualification 'Teacher of the Deaf', as recognised by the Department of Education.
- 3. Ability to design, adapt and teach effective lessons which provide engaging and inspirational learning activities across a wide range of ability levels including personalising learning to meet individual needs.
- 4. A good working knowledge and understanding of national curriculum key skills, current national curriculum initiatives and the relevant statutory and non-statutory curricula / frameworks e.g. SEND, NHSP.
- 5. Recent, relevant and successful teaching in some or all of the following: cross phase mainstream HIARP; specialist HI provision: HI peripatetic pre-school, mainstream & special schools KS 1-4
- 6. Working knowledge of the special education needs of deaf/hearing impaired children and young people.
- 7. Experience & working knowledge of assessment, recording, reporting & target setting procedures
- 8. Experience of working collaboratively with parents and a range of professionals working with SEND in Children and Young People
- 9. Able to communicate effectively in Sign Communication (BSL and SSE)
- 10. Good organisational skills and time management
- 11. Good working knowledge of audiological management and use of residual hearing

Desirable:

- Significant knowledge, skills and experience of working with children and young people with hearing impairment/deaf in a mainstream or specialist HI context using a using a range of communication approaches (Aural/oral, SSE 1.
- Signature Level 2 qualification (or above) in BSL or be prepared to undertake 2. training to this level
- Qualifications or training in relevant complementary areas (e.g. KS/4+Post 16 curriculum area, MLD, EBD, Counselling, Educational Audiology, Early Years and Deafness, NHSP etc) 3.
