4	Experience of classroom organisation & its impact upon pupil learning / well-being – specifically experience in making appropriate adjustments to meet the needs of autistic learners
5	Level 3 Support Assistant qualification (or equivalent level)
6	Level 2 Basic Skills (Literacy and Numeracy) or equivalent competency

7	Experience of working in an ARP / Special School setting
8	Experience of supporting pupils with communication and interaction needs using specific intervention programmes eg. box time activities
9	Knowledge of SEND Code of Practice – especially applicability to pupils with an EHCP
10	Experience in delivering specific academic interventions to support learning in core subject, including an understanding of associated assessments.

1	Experience of delivering targeted interventions
2	Able to support pupils with SEND using a range of strategies and interventions such as box time, use of visuals and emotional regulation strategies.
3	Able to empathise with the needs of children and in particular able to establish positive relationships with pupils and support emotional wellbeing.
4	Able to consistently and effectively implement agreed behaviour management strategies – particularly when pupils' behaviour may become dysregulated or display signs of demand avoidance
5	Able to provide levels of individual attention, reassurance and help with learning tasks as appropriate to pupils' needs
6	Able to work within and apply all relevant school policies and schemes of work
7	Able to supervise groups of pupils.
8	Able to carry out and report on systematic observations of pupils' knowledge, understanding and skills.
9	Able to undertake routine invigilation and marking
10	Able to work effectively as part of a team
11	Committed to achieving further professional development
12	Appropriate behaviour and attitude towards safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people including: motivation to work with children and young people; ability to form and maintain appropriate relationships and personal boundaries with children and young people; emotional resilience in working with challenging behaviours; attitude to use of authority and maintaining discipline; able to work in partnership with other agencies.
