<p>Role and Content</p>	<p>Need to do</p>
<p><b>Job Purpose:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Blending classroom skills and relational skills together to help deliver programmes at a Hopespring Education centre. The work is predominantly with young people of secondary school age (11-16) who have been excluded or are otherwise in crisis in their education.</li> </ul> <p><b>Organisation context:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hopespring Education centres have an underpinning reflective and compassionate ethos and work with young people who have been excluded or are otherwise in crisis in their education.</li> <li>Hopespring Education centres are either a registered independent school or an alternative provision setting (in-plan to be registered with the DfE) delivering tailored educational and social interventions for young people. They utilise imaginative curricula and resources, passionate staff and tried and tested methods of engagement to educate young people and transform their lives.</li> </ul> <p><b>Role context:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>As part of the Hopespring Education team, you will be supporting the Head Teacher to ensure that the centre achieves success.</li> <li>Work alongside senior staff as part of a team that works closely together to support the young people in that class and act as a link person for their families.</li> <li>Plan and delivery of lessons; leading small group sessions as timetabled and providing 1-1 support as appropriate to bring excellence to the young people's learning experience.</li> <li>Support, development and line management will be delivered primarily by senior staff at the school.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Tasks:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Work in partnership with the Head Teacher and senior staff in the planning, resourcing and delivery of sessions and programmes for the young people. This may involve occasional after school activities, including celebration evenings.</li> <li>Assist in team-teaching including preparation of sessions when directed by the Head Teacher.</li> <li>Share in identifying individual development needs of students and establishing Individual Educational Plans to appropriately meet these needs.</li> <li>Support senior staff to ensure the suitability of the environment, facilities and premises in line with Health and Safety Policy.</li> <li>Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young persons with whom you may come into contact with.</li> <li>Support the effective operation of school systems and encourage and support young people to engage fully in all aspects of their individual programmes including extra curricula activities.</li> <li>Work as a team to help in tackling issues such as poor behaviour, child protection, substance abuse and other social issues that prevent whole person development.</li> <li>Foster and develop relationships with parents or carers and encourage active involvement with their child's programme.</li> <li>Represent Hopespring Education centres appropriately when dealing with external agencies, including preparing for and attending external meetings relating to the young person, such as CTMs, PEPs, LAC Reviews and emergency professionals-only meetings.</li> <li>Administration of various records and monitoring outcomes as required e.g.: registration, assessment, moderation, progress tracking and certification.</li> <li>Participate fully in all developmental opportunities including staff training and staff meetings.</li> <li>Engage with internal and external training opportunities to further develop classroom practise.</li> <li>Take on additional responsibilities for specific tasks as your role develops as directed by the Head Teachers.</li> </ul>

Experience	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A minimum of one year's relevant youth work, mentoring or classroom experience.</li> <li>• Proven track record of working with young people aged 11-16 years.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At least 1 years' experience of engaging effectively with young people in a school/ education setting.</li> </ul>
Character Based Lifestyle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Commitment to actively pursue the ongoing personal, professional and spiritual development (being understood as reflective and compassionate practise) of themselves in order to enhance the vision and ethos of Hopespring Education.</li> <li>• Attends and participates fully in morning reflections and staff conferences to enhance the relationships within the team.</li> <li>• Able to work sensitively with those of different cultures and faiths whilst having their own strong sense of self-reflection, and commitment to Equal Opportunities.</li> </ul>	
Additional requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• That the applicant lives within a reasonable travelling distance.</li> <li>• The applicant plays an active part in promoting the work of Hopespring Education.</li> <li>• Complete a DBS check prior to employment and the disclosure reveals no reason for the applicant being unsuitable to work with young people.</li> </ul>
