

Person Specification Social Worker

Part A

The following criteria (experience, skills and qualifications) will be used to short-list at the application stage:

Essential

Recognised Social Work Qualification, e.g., CQSW, CSS, DipSW, Degree in Social Work.

At least 2 years post qualifying experience in Statutory Social Work, health related Social Work or any additional service provision relevant to the post

Evidence of progression ie/ PQ Award or Practice Educator Award

Experience of extensive working with children and families with complex needs and health needs.

An ability to identify, analyse and manage risk

Able to create a rapport and build relationships with children, young people and families who are experiencing a high level of stress/and or crisis

Able to contribute to, and work within, a supportive team environment both within children's social care and health provision

Able to liaise effectively with health colleagues and other professionals, and act as lead professional on occasion when working as part of a multi-disciplinary team to achieve the best outcomes for children and families

Able to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of child development, parenting capacity, environmental factors and risk and protective factors, especially in relation to children with a health condition or disability

Able to summarise, analyse and evaluate complex information with a view to further planning for children and families

An ability and willingness to be present and available to families and children within the Ward environment and to be passionate about delivering face to face interventions with them on a day to day basis

A strong awareness of self, and resilience to manage setback and changes in planning for children and their families

An ability and willingness to work in an emotionally challenging environment including working with children with palliative diagnoses, life limiting conditions and their families

An ability to adapt to continual change and differences in presenting need in both children and their families

Excellent recording and report writing skills using electronic data information systems when needed, with an ability to produce written reports about service delivery

Demonstrate knowledge, understanding and application of relevant legislation and statutory guidance

Effective assessment, planning and reviewing skills, with the ability to prioritise tasks and manage workload

A Committed to Equal Opportunities and anti-discrimination practice in employment and service delivery

Desirable

Able to offer informal advice to health colleagues and other professionals with regard to family support, and to deliver multi-disciplinary team presentations to a diverse professional audience about the same when needed/requested

Knowledge and understanding of current issues and trends in relation to children with complex health conditions and disability

Able to contribute to personal continuous service development

Part B

The following criteria will be further explored at the interview stage (as well as further exploring the above criteria is met):

Post qualifying experience, including experience in Statutory Social Work and other related experience within a Health Setting/Children with Disability Team or other service provision

Knowledge of relevant legislation and statutory guidance

Evidence of being reliable, self-reliant, emotionally resilient and confident, but will seek guidance appropriately

Willingness to undertake further training as required, with a positive approach to self-development

Evidence of good written and verbal communication skills
