This will also include managing our new home 'Maple House' which will have four beds and support young people moving on from a period within the secure setting.

Aycliffe Secure Centre

Aycliffe Secure Centre in Newton Aycliffe looks after some of the most vulnerable young people, many of whom have complex problems and need intensive support.

Our philosophy at the centre is 'Exceptional Parenting.' Keeping young people safe and providing a nurturing environment so they can heal and re-engage in life.

The centre provides secure accommodation for up to 34 young people, 8 of whom are sentenced or remanded by the Youth Custody Service and 26 young people who are accommodated for their own or other safety under Section 25 of the Children's Act 1989 and are commissioned by local authorities.
