



Hutton Rudby Primary School Information Sheet

Hutton Rudby Primary School is a single form entry school with 204 children on roll. The children are organised into 7, single year group classes. We are proud to have recently welcomed 3 Ukrainian children into our school, taking our percentage of children with English as an additional language to 4.5%.



We are in the process of federating with the Synergy Schools Federation, a group of 4 North Yorkshire schools that share a governing body and Executive Headteacher. We already work collaboratively with colleagues from these schools to improve practice and performance across all the schools. We hope that this process will be completed before May Half-Term.

Our school is at the heart of the local community. The picturesque village of Hutton Rudby is situated near Stokesley in the North of North Yorkshire. It is approximately 20 minutes south of Middlesbrough.

At Hutton Rudby we have 8 classrooms, a hall, a large playing field, a woodland area and 2 playgrounds. We also have changing rooms for the children in Upper Key Stage 2. We take great pride in the school plays and pantomimes that we produce at Hutton Rudby Primary School, as well as the extra-curricular opportunities that the children have access to in terms of performing arts (the children currently have the opportunity to learn guitar, drums, keyboard, piano and a number of brass instruments).



Between members of staff and outside providers, we offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities; from football to skateboarding these activities engage and excite the children. We do not only offer sports clubs, however, we also offer the children the chance to engage with clubs surrounding LEGO, Warhammer and more! We even have a salt-water aquarium with a variety of tropical fish that the children care for at Wildlife Club!

An engaging Sports Week is one of the many highlights of our school year. The children have the chance to access sports from wheelchair basketball to rock climbing. We aim to give the children the chance to access sports that they would not normally have the chance to enjoy. Children have the opportunity to compete in a range of sporting competitions with other local schools.



School work closely with the Swaledale Alliance – a group of 59 local schools in the north of North Yorkshire – allowing staff excellent CPD opportunities and support.
